

2016-2017 Program Outcomes Report

Clinical Mental Health Counseling (CMHC) program

In this reporting period (through Spring 2017) 25 students graduated. The overall Completion rate within the expected time frame is 94% for this group of recent graduates. This completion rate includes both CMHC students and Dual students (these complete both the CMHC and SC programs). The overall completion rate within the expected time frame for the CMHC program alone is 100% and for the Dual (both CMHC and SC programs) is 66%. In the current reporting period, the number of years to complete the CMHC program has varied from 2.7 years to 3.7 years with an average of 3 years, and the number of years to complete the Dual (both CMHC and SC programs) has varied from 2.3 to 3.7 years with an average of 3.3 years. The Counseling and Human Development program does not operate on a strict cohort model and accommodates both full-time and part-time students. Most all students work full-time while they are in the program and thus their student status (full-time vs part-time) may vary from semester to semester. Those who start as full-time students and wish to maintain employment, becomes part-time students during Practicum and Internship. Over eight of the last ten years, CHMC (including Dual) students have a 100% pass rate on the NCE for initial licensure, including an 89% pass rate in 2016-2017. The job placement rate for CMHC (and Dual) students over the last 180 days is 80% this includes those who graduated in May, 2017.

School Counseling (SC) program

In this reporting period (through Spring 2017) 8 students graduated. The completion rate within the expected time frame is 100% for this group of recent graduates. In the current reporting period the number of years to complete the SC program has varied from 2 to 3.7 years, with an average of 2.7 years. The Counseling and Human Development program does not operate on a strict cohort model and accommodates both full-time and part-time students. Most all students work full-time while they are in the program and thus their student status (full-time vs part-time) may vary from semester to semester. Those who start as full-time students and wish to maintain employment, become part-time during Practicum and Internship. Over the eight of the last ten years, SC students have a 100% pass rate on the SC licensure exam. The initial pass rate for 2016-2017 was 63% and 100% pass rate in the subsequent administration of the exam. The job placement rate for SC students over the last 180 days is 63%; this includes those who graduated in May, 2017.
