Entrance into the Master of Occupational Therapy Program

Specific application requirements, to be submitted on OTCAS include the following:.

Students matriculating in the Master of Occupational Therapy program at Walsh University must have:

- B.S. or B.A. degree (or in final year)
- Minimum 3.0 GPA in 3 of 5 prerequisite courses (completed) for interview eligibility
- Complete all prerequisites before matriculation*
- Transcripts from all previously attended institutions
- Three letters of recommendation (may include academic or professional references)
- Minimum 20 hours of observation in two different settings
- Virtual Interview (by invitation)
- TOEFL score (international students only)

Frequently Asked Questions

What is unique about the clinical experiences at Walsh?

Students will complete Level I fieldwork rotations that include both in-person and virtual /simulated experiences during the 2nd, 3rd and 4th semester of coursework. These rotations will have site-specific objectives related to your didactic content. In the 5th & 6th semesters of the program, students will complete Level II fieldwork which is full-time for 12 weeks with the expectation that the student will be at an entry-level occupational therapy practitioner at the completion of 24 weeks of Fieldwork II experiences.

Do I need to have a Bachelor's degree to apply and be admitted to Walsh University's Master of Occupational Therapy program?

You do not need to have completed your degree to apply or be interviewed however, you must have completed your degree and all of the pre-requisite coursework prior to beginning the graduate MOT coursework. Your degree can be in any field as long as you have completed the pre-requisite coursework.

How can I determine if a course at my institution will meet a specific pre-requisite requirement?

We have an equivalency chart in the Office of Graduate Admissions. If your course is not yet on the list, we will complete a syllabus review to determine if the course will meet the requirement.

How many observation hours are required?

We strongly recommend students complete at least 20 hours of observation in at least two different OT locations. You must be supervised by a licensed occupational therapist, or occupational therapy assistant for the observation hours. Hours must be verified with a signature from the supervising therapist and include the name of the site.

If I am already a licensed Occupational Therapy Assistant (OTA), do I need to complete the observation hour requirement?

No, if you successfully passed the OTA NBCOT exam, you do not need to complete the observation hours.

How long will it take to complete the program?

The program is six consecutive semesters beginning in the fall.

Does the OT program accept transfer credits from other MOT Programs?

Yes, Walsh University reviews transfer credits case by case. Students may transfer equivalent coursework from an ACOTE-accredited OT program, depending on course content, grades, and documentation, including proof of good standing.
