

Change of Status: F-2 Dependent to F-1 Student

To change your status while in the United States from a F-2 dependent to a F-1 student, you will need to be admitted to a full-time academic program at a school that can issue you a Form I-20. In addition, your F-1 spouse must be in the U.S. and in status when you are requesting this change.

Note: If you are traveling outside the United States, you can accomplish the change of status upon reentry if you take your Form I-20 and financial documents with you and obtain a F-1 Visa at a U.S. Consulate. Upon obtaining the F-1 Visa, you can enter the United States as a F-1 student.

As a F-2 visa holder, you are not eligible to be a full-time student. However, you are able to take courses on a part-time basis. Therefore, if you wish to study full time, you must apply for a change of status from a F-2 dependent to a F-1 student. F-2 visa holders also may not receive wages or compensation of any kind until the F-1 student status is approved.

Your request for change of status to the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) should consist of the following:

- Completed Form I-539 with the online processing fee of \$420 and the \$85 Biometrics fee. Checks and money orders should be made payable to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security. For the most current fee information, visit the Fee Schedule. It is recommended that you file and pay online.
- Receipt for paying SEVIS I-901 Fee. Go to FMJfee.com for full details.
- Copies of F-2 Dependent and F-1 Student Form I-20s, signed and dated
- Copy of the front and back of the Form I-94 card or printed copy of electronic I-94 card and copy of admission stamp. You can find this at <u>cpb.gov</u>.
- Financial verification
- Copies of your dependent's valid immigration forms: I-94, I-20
- Copies of the pages in each individual's passport that include biographical information, passport picture and passport expiration
- Proof of enrollment or admission to the university
