Curriculum Sheets, Catalog, and Spring 2027 Schedule Edits- IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Updates to the current catalog, curriculum sheets for the 2026-2027 academic year, and the Spring 2027 schedule will begin soon. Our office will send three separate emails- one for catalog revisions, one for curriculum sheet updates, and one for Spring 2027 schedule edits- each containing detailed instructions for completing the required changes. Deans, chairs, and directors are asked to review these messages carefully, reach out with any questions about the process, and plan ahead to ensure all departmental edits are completed and submitted by March 1.

These updates are essential to ensure that students, advisors and faculty have accurate academic information. Please double check all updates for accuracy, as once the information goes live, it will be visible to students and advisors who rely on it for advising. Making corrections after publication can be difficult and should be avoided.
